- *Continuing efforts to keep Big Oil's "mega-loads" off Highway 12.*
- *Halting mining exploration on the Boise River, Big Creek and others.*
- *Barring suction dredge miners from disrupting riverbeds throughout the state.*

We've won rounds on each case, but these fights aren't over yet. 2016 promises to be a pivotal year for our Idaho river work – and we need your help!

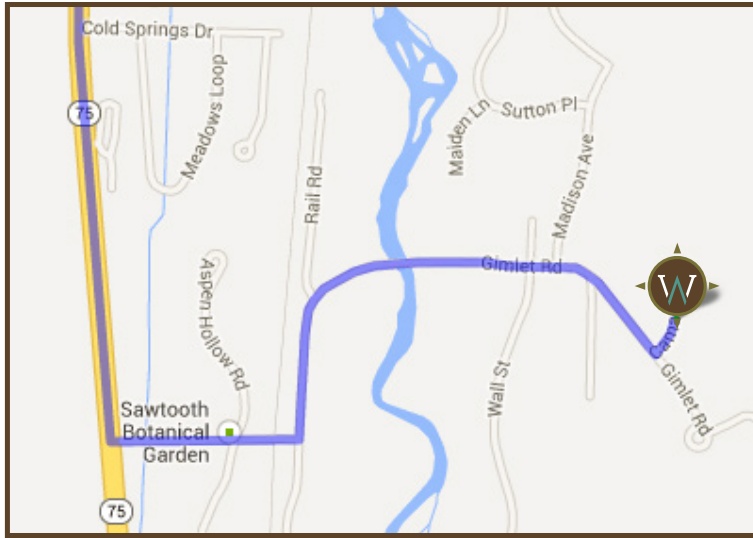
